Description:

Are you our ideal candidate? The Boring Water District is seeking someone with the following skills, experience, and traits to join our team: A dependable, responsible contributor, with a positive attitude committed to professionalism, excellence, and success. Someone with an eye for details who is versatile, adaptable, with a willingness to learn, and open to change to join our team and fill a newly created position, in the water operation and maintenance department. Under supervision of the District Manager, This is a hands on position that requires physical abilities to work in the field supervising subs and/or performing a variety of semi-skilled and skilled construction, operation, and maintenance tasks in the construction, operation, repair, maintenance, and replacement of District facilities and infrastructure. Perform related tasks as required. Respond to emergencies during and after regular working hours.

The District:

The Boring Water District is governed by a 5 member Board of Directors, serving 4 year terms. The District was formed in the late 1960's. The people of Boring saw the need for a community water system to avoid local water quality problems and provide a safe, reliable water supply. The important demands were the school and lumber mill. Agricultural users were also a part of the initial urgency for reliable water. Construction finished in 1972. Since the initial construction the District has grown to now include:

- 3 welded steel reservoirs totaling 900,000 gallons of storage
- 4 deep aquifer ground-water wells, capable of delivering 1,050 GPM combined
- 2 high level pump stations with associated controls
- 750 + connections serving residential, commercial, industrial, and agricultural customers
- 110 fire hydrants providing fire protection.
- Over 26 miles in network piping.

The Boring Water District currently has 2 FTEs and 2 PTEs. BWD is self-sufficient. The District does not receive any revenues from property taxes, just water sold. BWD has been able to provide pristine, non-chlorinated drinking water to our customers since the 1st drop was delivered. The District has no water treatment facility, or water right concerns. The water rights held by the District are sufficient to address any projected future demand. The District takes pride in the purity of the water putting stringent, exceptional, construction and maintenance standards in place to ensure the quality continues for generations to come.

The Area:

Located in unincorporated Clackamas County, between Mt. Hood and Portland, just off Hwy 26, Boring is a rural area that still retains much of the small town feel. Offering 2 golf courses, a local wine tasting venue, local fruits and produce seasonally, a maintained walking/biking trail connected to neighboring communities, an equestrian center hosting a variety of community events, among other things. While only minutes from surrounding cities, west are the cities of Damascus, Happy Valley, and Clackamas. East is the City of Sandy with lots of local attractions, and it is about 20 minutes further to the recreational areas of Mt. Hood, providing skiing at 3 different destinations, including Timberline Lodge, hiking, camping, fishing, and hunting activities, etc. North about 20 minutes is the scenic Columbia River Gorge area that offers a wide variety of activities from water recreation to hiking and camping. Northwest is the city of Gresham offering shopping and food. Just a few minutes further is downtown Portland with a night life of restaurants of all types; food carts to fine dining, entertainment options, including NBA, NHL, minor league baseball and pro soccer games, concerts, wine venues, brewery's, comedy clubs, the PDX zoo, Portland International Raceway, Washington Park and the rose garden. Boring is located within a couple of hours drive to the Oregon coast recreational areas, the state capital city of Salem, home of the state fair, and much of eastern Oregon recreational areas.
